
Walk 3: Bridgetown over the hills to Dulverton

4.5 miles / 2-2½ hours one way. Return by bus, or back by the same way.

Coming out of the campsite, turn right and walk up the road for 140yds. Turn left down the track marked by the bridleway sign with the blue mark. Go through the gate with blue marking and follow the field up to the right before going through the gate halfway up on your right. Turn left and walk up the field keeping the hedge on your left. At the top of the field there is a gate on the left with a blue mark on. Follow the track for a short distance, but look out for the path that veers uphill to your right and is marked by a Bridleway sign with a blue mark. Follow that small track uphill and then across a staggered junction (quick right, then left) to a gate. Go through the gate into the field keeping the hedge on your right. Go through the gate at far right corner with a blue mark. Turn left following the yellow footpath sign to Milton's Bridge. Turn left in the farm onto the tarmac road and follow that down to the woods. Follow the tarmac road down the slope – it will curve to the left before you take the sharp fork to the right, carrying on down the tarmac track to the stream. At the bottom cross the river/bridge with the farm silos on your left. Footpath to Broford sign. Carry on the track with the river on your left (yellow sign/marker). Turn left at the track junction, heading up hill slightly. At the multiple path junction, take the right hand path up the hill and marked with a yellow sign. Go through the gate into the field and initially follow the track, then keep the hedge on your right. Go through the gate at the far right corner, keeping the hedge on your right. Carry on through the gate at the next far right corner crossing over a track into the field opposite. Keeping the hedge still on your right, go through the gate at the far right corner. Turn left down the tarmac road, and just before the farm turn right (blue marked sign up high) and there will be a barn on your right. Keeping straight, pass through the gate and then down across the field to the gate opposite. Follow the track and zigzag through the woods, crossing the stream and turning left. Go through the wooden gate with a blue mark and up the field keeping the hedge to your left. As you pass through the gate at the top, head towards the trees with the fence on your left. Go through another gate, again keeping the fence on your left. You then pass through 2 small gates with blue marks. Head for a gate with a blue mark on it, halfway along the left hand hedge and then head up to the tree to the left of the house. Pass through the metal gate with a blue mark and then another, following the public bridleway sign to Dulverton. Keep the hedge on your left and pass through the 2 gates at the top, then turning left as indicated by the blue bridleway sign. Take the path to the right of the Trig point/pilar, heading for the second gap in the hedge on your right. Go through the metal gate with a blue sign for the public bridleway to Dulverton. Keep the hedge on your right and go through the gate with a blue mark in the far corner. Keep the hedge and trees on your right and go through the gate in the far corner. Carry straight on, passing through another gate with a blue mark. At the end of the track bear right into a field. Keep the fence on your left and go through the gate at the end. Then, shortly after, double back to your right, through a metal gate with a blue mark. Turn left onto the public byway – sign Dulverton ½. Carry on along down the track (NOT going through the left had gate just past the footpath turning on your right). Just past the first house on a bend, turn right past the church and carry on down into town.
